SIDES OF A GARDEN OR LANDSCAPE MIRROR EACH OTHER, WHILE ASYMMETRICAL BALANCE CREATES A MORE DYNAMIC ARRANGEMENT THAT STILL FEELS STABLE.

3. SCALE AND PROPORTION

SCALE REFERS TO THE SIZE OF ELEMENTS IN RELATION TO ONE ANOTHER AND THE OVERALL SPACE, WHILE PROPORTION FOCUSES ON THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN PARTS OF A COMPOSITION. UNDERSTANDING SCALE AND PROPORTION IS ESSENTIAL FOR ENSURING THAT THE LANDSCAPE FEELS COMFORTABLE AND INVITING.

4. FOCAL POINT

A FOCAL POINT IS AN ELEMENT THAT DRAWS ATTENTION AND SERVES AS THE CENTERPIECE OF A LANDSCAPE. THIS COULD BE A SCULPTURE, A DISTINCTIVE TREE, OR A WATER FEATURE. THE PLACEMENT OF FOCAL POINTS CAN GUIDE VISITORS THROUGH THE SPACE AND CREATE VISUAL INTEREST.

5. RHYTHM AND LINE

RHYTHM INVOLVES THE REPETITION OF ELEMENTS TO CREATE A SENSE OF MOVEMENT WITHIN THE LANDSCAPE, WHILE LINE REFERS TO THE PATHWAYS AND SHAPES THAT LEAD THE EYE THROUGH THE DESIGN. BOTH RHYTHM AND LINE ARE CRUCIAL FOR ESTABLISHING FLOW AND GUIDING MOVEMENT.
